The Evolution of Dignity

RAPID CITY, SD - The Journey Museum & Learning Center is excited to announce the first event in its Spring Learning Forum series, set for 2 p.m. on Sunday, January 14th, titled, "The Evolution of Dignity". Sculptor and South Dakota Artist Laureate, Dale Lamphere, will re-visit the building process behind his Dignity Native American sculpture in Chamberlain, SD.

The monument Dignity was installed and dedicated on September 17, 2016. Lamphere will discuss the engineering and artistic challenges his team encountered while creating the 50-foot-tall statue. In addition, Lamphere will explain the models and tools used during the project and reveal what's ahead for the future of Dignity.

"Long into the future, this sculpture will still stand as a symbol of individual human dignity and shared human experience," said Lamphere. "The opportunities for this important location to become an innovative site for creative and cultural outreach are tremendous."

Learning Forums are wide-ranging, thought-provoking presentations. Each program features a forty-five minute presentation, followed by an open forum with questions and discussion about the topic.

Admission is \$12 for adults, \$10 for seniors, half-off for members & free for students with a paid adult/senior admission (includes museum admission).
