Growing Up With The Legend Joe Foss

RAPID CITY, SD - The Journey Museum & Learning Center announces the final event in its Fall Turtle Soup Lecture Series, set for noon on Friday, November 17th, titled “Growing Up with the Legend Joe Foss”. Jeff Carsrud will cover the fascinating life of native South Dakotan Joe Foss.

“Growing Up with the Legend Joe Foss” Turtle Soup will be held in the Stanford Adelstein Gallery, housing the Journey Museum’s latest exhibit, Wild Blue Yonder - The Story of Ellsworth AFB.

Joe Foss was born in 1915 near Sioux Falls, SD and went on to serve in the U.S. military, earning the Medal of Honor and Distinguished Flying Cross. Foss held numerous public offices, serving as a state representative and as 20th governor of South Dakota. In 1959 he became the first NFL American League Commissioner. Foss was inducted into the South Dakota Hall of Fame in 1978 and into the Aviation Hall of Fame in 1983.

Jeff Carsrud is president and owner of Winsupply Rapid City. He was born and raised in Gillette, WY and is married with two children, Justin and Leslie. Carsrud enjoys bow and gun hunting for big game and migratory birds, amateur league baseball, fly and marine fishing, camping, backpacking with my son, boating, water skiing, motocross, snowmobiling, snorkeling, mountain biking, golf, coffee shops, fantasy leagues, NASCAR, work and life.
